# HINDUISM

Hinduism is the oldest religion in the world and is the faith of over eighty percent of the people of India, Nepal, Java and millions living in other parts of world.

The word *Hindu* is of geographic origin and was derived from the name originally given to the people settled on the river 'Sindhu: says Shakunthala Gangannathan in her book "Hinduism an Introduction." It was later on corrupted by people to the word 'Hindu" and the faith of the Hindus was given the name "Hinduism" in English language.

Although *Hinduism* is a religion it is more; it includes theology, social institutions, a legal tradition, a vast body of literature and art, science and a great varied mass of philosophy.

Hinduism consists of religious works such as Vedas and Upanishads. The oldest Vedic work, the Rig Veda was


compiled around 1000 B.C. The Upanishads seem to date back to 7 or early 6th century B.C.

Hinduism also has three great epics such as Mahabharata, Ramayana and Bhagayatam.

The three main forms of deities worshiped symbolize the three main energies or sciences of this universe. They

- 1) Brahma: God of Creation (or the science of creation).
- 2) Vishnu: God of preservation (or the science of preservation).
- 3) Shiva: God of Destruction (or the science of destruction).

People who worship Shiva were called "Shaivas" and those that of Vishnu were "Vaishnavas." Although Hinduism embraces many Gods, its highest goal strives to achieve and experience the ultimate reality - the OM. Achieving the ultimate one or OM is the main preparation of all Hindu literature, philosophy and worship. The religion also encourages people to live in harmony within themselves. On one of my visits to Swami Chinmayananda's spiritual lecture I was able to understand my religion much better and the philosophy a little clearer. Swami Chinmayananda best describes this with a simple chart.



This explains the various stages we have to go through to achieve the ultimate one or OM.







