"YOUTH & RELIGEOUS CORNER" VIEWS ON HINDUISM:

People always question why someone claim to be a follower of particular "ISM" without really understanding what they claim to have understood. The follower of "ISMS" claim that their ISM is the ONLY ONE WAY to God, to Truth, to Salvation and to the Life itself. (Then a logical question arises that before these "ISMS" were conveived, about 2000 years ago, is that true that people didn't know the God, the truth and never attained salvation?!). But for a Hindu it is not so. His beliefs are many, his flexibility is boundless and each defines his perception differentially and yet believes in the same. So Hinduism is not a religion. It is a way of life. So, Hinduism can be viewed as a deviation of Arya Dharma or Vaidika Dharma or Sanatana Dharma where Dharma can be loosely translated as universal law or righteousness. The concept of Dharma is a big package and can be viewed as a conglomeration of many little packages or smaller concepts. They include Bhakti (devotion) based on beliefs, Gnana (knowledge) based on wisdom, Karma (duties) based on actions and Aachara (practices) -- compassion packaged laws and the mind teasing sciences (Shastras) all interwoven into a series of ritual do's and don'ts.

For Hindus, the challange is that you should study your scriptures understand the deepest meeaning in every word and every sentence. Study the scriptures of other faiths with open mind and lolgic. Then come to your own conclusion. If you come to a conclusion that our Sanata Dharma, our eternal religion is worth saving and passing on to your children, the way we got from our forefathers, start a serious VICHAR (thinking), bring your vichar into day to day AACHAR (practice), show that in every of your UCCHAR(AN)(pronunciation) and finally translate your thoughts and undertake the PRACHAR (propagation). This synchronization of thought, practice, pronunciation and propagation is essential for the revival of the Hindu phylosophy of life.

"THIS & THAT" by 1. Ramachandra Reddy


(The items featured here are heard or read by me somewhere. Few of them are my personal experiences learnt the hardway by making mistakes - T.R.R.)
