Maha Shivarathri is marked by three main rituals of fasting, praying, and keeping vigil (Jagarun). What do these disciplines signify?

Fasting has the salutary effect of lessening the demands of the physical body and thereby the associated distractions of the mind. Fasting results in 'quietening' the mind.

Prayer gives a healthy preoccupation to the 'quietened' mind by turning its total attention to the Supreme Self, the object of true realization. Prayer thus improves the 'quality' of the already 'Serene' mind. Such a disciplined mind enjoys the right quality and direction of thoughts.

Keeping Vigil (Jagarun) marks a conscious effort to stay 'alert' and 'vigilant' to accomplish set goal, a determination to achieve success conquering the inertia of the body.

A 'quiet', 'disciplined', 'alert' mind is a prerequisite for any psychological, intellectual or spiritual achievement. One who follows the dictates of Maha Shivarathri in a sincere way, accomplishes success in any chosen field by conquering the wandering mind, inertia of the body and approach issues in a well disciplined manner.


